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DESCRIPTION

2017 is the 50th Anniversary of the Nova Scotia Human Rights Commission. To celebrate the protection and promotion of human rights in the province, the Commission, in collaboration with <u>Partners for Human Rights</u>, is inviting Nova Scotia youth ages 12-24 to submit their original works for art for exhibition and display in Nova Scotia. **Deadline: Tuesday, April 18, 2017.**

Top works will be featured:

- On Halifax Transit interior bus signage July 2017
- At the Halifax Stanfield International Airport Fall 2017
- In an exhibit at the Halifax Central Library May 2017 and other locations across the province (dates and locations to be announced).
- On social media channels: Commission's Facebook page, Twitter, etc.
- On printed posters (for select submissions).

Theme: Human Rights for all Nova Scotians.

The Nova Scotia Human Rights Commission was established in 1967 with the view of protecting and promoting human rights in the province. Youth are invited to create works of art that illustrate or provide their interpretations of one or multiple human rights. For example, the following rights are protected by the Nova Scotia Human Rights Act.
